

**The Carnegie Trust for the Universities of Scotland
Carnegie-Cameron Taught Postgraduate Bursaries
Deadline 30 June 2011**

The University of Stirling has received funding to allocate two postgraduate awards for 2011 entry. A bursary can only be awarded to a student beginning a one-year taught postgraduate degree course (or part-time over two consecutive years). Pre-doctoral programmes, postgraduate diplomas and postgraduate certificates are not funded by this scheme.

Each award is worth £3,400 for 2011/12 and will be deducted from the successful candidate's tuition fees.

Eligibility

Applicants must be Scottish by birth or descent (at least one parent born in Scotland) or have been continuously resident in Scotland for a period of at least three years for the purpose of secondary or tertiary education in Scotland. Residence in Scotland for any other purpose does not make an applicant eligible. Vacations, periods of absence through illness and periods spent outside Scotland as part of a Scottish educational course shall not be taken into account in determining whether the residency has been continuous.

Applicants must already have been offered and accepted an unconditional place to study on a postgraduate taught programme at the University of Stirling in order to be considered.

Criteria

Bursaries will be awarded on the basis of an overall assessment of the merit and promise of the candidate, including their financial circumstances. While the most promising candidates will normally have a first-class honours degree or equivalent, this is not essential. The ultimate criteria for the award of a bursary will be those envisaged by Andrew Carnegie – that the candidate be qualified and deserving, industrious and ambitious and that the candidate would derive particular benefit from a one-year, taught, postgraduate degree which he or she would be unlikely to enjoy without the award.
