Referencing from the Bible

When referencing from the Bible you should include the following information in your note: book, chapter, verse and version of the Bible which you have consulted. There is no requirement to put the Bible in your bibliography. For example a note would read:

1. 1 Cor. 4:5, 6:1-2, 10:1 (the New Jerusalem Bible).

You may wish to abbreviate the name of the version of the Bible which you have consulted if you are referring to it several times in a piece of work, e.g.

1. 1 Cor. 4:5, 6:1-2, 10:1 (NJB).
